May 25
2004 The first CAT rides were given.

May 6
2004 The official dedication of CAT.

December
2003 Bismarck State College student, Catherine Dalzell, won the CAT logo competition.

August
2003 Named fixed route Capital Area Transit or CAT.

2001 Bis-Man Transit Board decide to pursue adding fixed routes. The Bismarck City Commission and Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) accepted the proposal.

August
2000 Transit study of Bismarck and Mandan began.

1998 Built and moved in to the Bismarck-Mandan Transit Center on East Rosser.

September
1990 Final notification that the plan and application were approved for Bis-Man Transit to receive Urban Mass Transit Authority (UMTA) funding.

May
1990 Limited paratransit service for individuals with developmental disabilities was started.

December
1989 Transit study results were in. Community too small/not enough interest for fixed route. However, study solidified the need to move forward with paratransit

1988 Transit study of Bismarck and Mandan began.

April 28
1987 The Bis-Man Transit Board officially became incorporated.

1986 Community committee began meeting about elderly/disabled transportation concerns.
