Meeting was called to order at 6 p.m.

Presentation: Roy Rickert presented the timeline of the proposal draft, as well as changes to the proposal document since the final listening session. Moving forward, the fare increases, change in paratransit service hours, and pursuit of additional funding would go into effect as of January 1, 2017. On April 1, 2017, changes to the fixed route structure would take place. July 1, 2017, would be the final cutoff date for recertification, the potential end of service to Lincoln unless an agreement had been finalized, and the sale of semester fixed route passes would begin. Kim Badenhop requested the first item under the Implementation Timeline be changed from pursuing local funding to begin studying options for additional local funding.

Public Hearing: The public hearing opened at 6:26 p.m. Comments made during the public hearing included the following:

Bis-Man Transit delivers valued public transportation, linking people, jobs and communities.

- Increase holiday service hours on Christmas to allow individuals to spend more time with family.
- What kind of guarantee does Bis-Man Transit have on what kind of money will be made from the pilot program to the University of Mary?
- Bring a proposal to the City of Lincoln for what the city should pay to maintain paratransit service.
- The Senior Center supports moving the paratransit age qualifier to 70. Will the application be different, and to what extent?
- Will volunteers be allowed continued usage of the paratransit system?
- Allowing independent living advocates to serve as verification of disability.
- Will the location of the bus shelter at the High Rise remain in the same location?
- It is not realistic to believe people utilizing the paratransit will begin riding the fixed route.
- Will there be resources available to help potential paratransit customers fill out the application?
- How will the paratransit application work for individuals with mental disabilities and not physical disabilities?

The public hearing was closed at 7:08 p.m.

Question Responses: Board members and staff noted some of the questions asked during the public hearing and provided responses as follows:

- The purpose of the draft proposal is not to approve the application process. The application is an administrative issue. The application will be standard to applications nationwide, using checkboxes. Another document will be sent to a health care provider. The application will help determine if an individual is not able to ride the fixed route mode of service.
- The organization is looking for a plan to be proposed by the City of Lincoln that will outline the City's contribution for the paratransit system.
- The University of Mary estimates that about 500 weekly rides will be generated by extending service to the campus. If ridership doesn't meet what is projected, the route will be altered.
- A contract will be negotiated with ServeYes to determine the future of volunteer usage of the paratransit system.
- Christmas holiday hours may be extended administratively, depending on data collected about usage.
- The bus shelter at the High Rise will be moved to a different location on the block to accommodate the changing fixed route.
- The changes to the fixed route are self-sustaining. Nothing done to the fixed route is coming from resources dedicated to the paratransit mode of service.
- Presently there is no public transportation alternative for the public after 7 p.m. The Extended Hours Service will provide that alternative.

Consideration of Proposal: Steve Heydt moved to change the paratransit age qualification from 75 to 70. Glenn Lauinger seconded the motion and it carried 5-3. DeNae Kautzmann moved to accept the proposal as amended. Kim Badenhop seconded the motion carried unanimously.

Adjourn: The meeting closed at 7:52 p.m..

Meeting was called to order at 11:30 a.m.

Approval of Agenda: Steve Heydt moved to approve the agenda. Karel Sovak seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.

Consent Agenda: Kim Badenhop asked why ridership went up but revenue went down. Roy Rickert explained that fewer monthly passes had been sold, and individuals utilizing passes has gone up. Steve Heydt moved to approve the consent agenda. Jeannie Pedersen seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.

Update of System Revisions: Roy Rickert said following the most recent public hearing, changes to the revision were made as directed by the Board. This document was forwarded to the City of Bismarck and is an agenda item for the Bismarck City Commission's Nov. 8 meeting. Due to the

current service contract with the City ending on Dec. 31, 2016, and both the City and Transit Board needing to sign the document, Roy Rickert suggested creating an extension amendment to the current contract that would allow for a month-to-month extension until the new contract is signed. Steve Heydt moved to approve the amendment to the contract. Jeannie Pedersen seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.

Discussion of Workload Timeline: Roy Rickert presented a document outlining many of the ongoing and future projects the organization will work on. These projects include the following:

- **RFP for Auditing Services** This RFP has been distributed, but no responses have been received. However, there have been inquiries made to the organization. The audit will be conducted in May 2017.
- **2014 Triennial** The organization sent paperwork to the FTA from the last four paratransit cutaways. If accepted, this paperwork should close the 2014 Triennial.
- **2017 Triennial** The pre-visit paperwork has begun for the 2017 Triennial. Roy Rickert estimated the Triennial would be in March or April, based on previous timelines.
- **Grants** The 5339 grant application is due Dec. 23, 2016, and a transportation plan is due prior to the 5310 grant submission. The state may combine the 5339 and 5310 applications in the future.
- NTD The NTD report is due Spring 2017.
- **RFP for Operations** The Operations contract expires June 30, 2017, and the RFP will need to be created soon.
- **Telephone System RFP** A new telephone system is projected to save the organization money, but the RFP for the new system has not yet been started.
- **System Rebrand** This project will likely be started following the completion of other projects.
- **Website RFP** This project will likely be started following the completion of other projects.

Glenn Lauinger said some of the changes that are proposed are in violation of the organization's bylaws. DeNae Kautzmann said there must be 10 days notice given to the Board of Directors and a 2/3 majority vote is needed to make changes to bylaws or to adopt new bylaws. Steve Heydt moved to update bylaws and articles of incorporation after the organization agrees on a contract with the City with the Executive Committee to review and draft amendments to the bylaws and the articles of incorporation.

Meeting Date Change: Kim Badenhop moved to change the November meeting date to Nov. 18. Kim Stevenson seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.

Discussion of City Ordinances: Roy Rickert said that in looking at city ordinances, buses are not allowed to stop anywhere but bus stops approved by the City. The ordinances do not differentiate paratransit cutaways, fixed route buses or school buses. Steve Saunders said a committee is being formed that will include the traffic engineer, Bismarck administration, Roy Rickert and others.

Executive Director's Report: The first stage of the Triennial will be completed by December 16, 2016. Roy Rickert has been in contact with Lincoln mayor Gerald Wise, and is providing him with

information he has requested. The organization is working with the Army National Guard to create an appeal letter to help pay for passes for veterans. The organization received the expected amount for the sale of non-public stocks.

Administrative Committee: No Updates

Finance Committee: No Updates

Board Application Committee: Marge Ellefson and Steve Heydt have applications and will set up a meeting for late November or early December to ensure preparation for the next year. Six members are up for renewal. Following their meeting, the committee will bring it back to the full board for discussion. Kim Stevenson and Jeannie Pedersen requested to join the committee and were added.

Adjourn: Steve Heydt moved to adjourn. Kim Badenhop seconded the motion. The meeting adjourned at 12:46 p.m..

OCTOBER 2016 ANALYTICS OVERVIEW

Website

In spite of a decline of about 11.5% of the user audience from the previous month, page views increased by nearly 500 views (9.36%) from September 2016. Along with the increase in page views, users were drilling deeper into the site (a 12.25% increase in pages per session from 2.53 in September to 2.84 in October) and remaining on the site for 16 seconds longer as compared to the previous month, and 22 seconds longer as compared to the previous October. A decline in new users (1087 in October, as compared to 1269 in September) was offset by an 18.51% increase in returning users (858 in Oct. 2016, compared to 724 the previous month). Mobile traffic continues to be the top producing method of site consumption, as sessions increased nearly 20% over last year (969 sessions in Oct. 2016 compared to 811 in Oct. 2015).

Facebook

Without a paid campaign this month, Facebook performance was down compared to the previous month, as well as versus October 2015. In the past the fixed route has had free ride days to promote, but this year there was no such promotion, and the platform was mostly carried by Tuesday Transit Trivia and the promotion of the transfer point change to Front after that paid campaign's monetary backing had been exhausted.

Twitter

Organic Impressions for October topped September (4076 impressions in Oct. vs. 3264 in Sept.) despite an 8.7% drop in the number of tweets posted for the month. Total engagement was down due to the absence of a paid campaign. Service changes and the day-of promotion of the transfer point change resulted in 5 of the 10 tweets that reached triple-digit reach, with those five posts accumulating the top five post reaches for the month (all over 500).

RouteShout

Three of the four metrics measured were down in October 2016 vs. the previous month, with all four down from the previous year.

Bis-Man Online

No campaigns were utilized in October 2016.

Mail Chimp

In one of the more successful e-newsletters sent out by the organization, the third-highest amount of campaign opens were recorded in spite of a smaller mailing list size as compared to the two higher recorded e-newsletters. The October 2016 e-newsletter marked just the second time double-digit campaign clicks were recorded, as the 11 clicks from this e-newsletter are the most recorded.
